Outgoing Kentucky Chamber Board Chair Diane Medley, Executive Chairman and Co-Founder of MCM CPAs and Advisors, enjoyed the business community being back in full swing during her time at the helm of the organization

and applauded the Chamber's distinct ability to meet the ever-evolving needs of companies and communities across the Commonwealth.

"I've served as chair of a lot of organizations, but this one is the best. The Chamber stays true to its mission and is quick to expand it when needed. Advocacy is a big part of that

as we focus on business-friendly issues in a way that no other organization can or is in a position to do. And when I look back, I am very proud of what we accomplished together," Medley said.

The Chamber saw success in many areas during Medley's term, which began October 1, 2021 and ended September 30, 2022. When asked about the organization's most impactful work, she began

by pointing to the effort in the 2022 legislative session to pass significant tax reform. In the summer of 2021, the Chamber brought the nonpartisan Tax Foundation into the state to analyze Kentucky's tax code and give recommendations on ways to improve upon it and make the Commonwealth more competitive. From there, the Chamber produced a report with recommendations and became the top

advocate for lowering Kentucky's individual income tax through House Bill 8, Kentucky's new law aimed at gradually bringing that tax to zero percent.

CALIPARI AND PAYNE SHARE INSIGHTS ON LEADERSHIP, COMPETITION, AND MORE AT

Chamber's Annual Meeting Dinner Sharing the stage for the first time as opposing men's basketball coaches, University of Kentucky (UK)'s John

Calipari and University of Louisville (UofL)'s Kenny Payne talked leadership and unity among other topics at the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce's 76th Annual Meeting Dinner.

At UK, Payne worked under Calipari as an assistant coach from 2010-2014 and as associate head coach from 2014-2020, before taking an assistant job for the NBA's New York Knicks and accepting the head coaching job at UofL in 2022.

Payne emphasized the importance of having mentors that care throughout an individual's career. Both coaches talked about their leadership styles and what drives them to coach. They also provided the audience a unique look into the demanding career of a college coach at a major division-1 basketball program.

"UofL's program is vital for our state. That program, in our biggest city, has to do things, and you have the perfect person to bring people together. I will hate playing and coaching against him but I'm happy to see him in this role. It's good for this state," Calipari said about Payne. "With that said, I still want to win."

"The one thing we have to remember is that it's not on this man (Calipari) to bring the rivalry, it's on us. It's on the University of Louisville. The state is only going to be as good as we both are. And that's one reason I took this job. We need the rivalry to not only be intense and competitive, but also respectful so that we can have both schools and the state on top." Payne said.

"With my background as a tax accountant for years, and the fact that MCM focuses on strategic planning, I think the Chamber's biggest accomplishment this year was definitely the tax reform bill. It took a lot of effort, work with other groups, and coordination with members of the General Assembly leading the charge. The fact that we are beginning to lower Kentucky's individual income tax is a huge step for the state and we are looking forward to continued progress in that area," Medley said

In the last year, the Chamber was also able to help the victims in both western Kentucky, impacted by devastating tornadoes, and eastern Kentucky, where we saw historic flooding. Medley noted the state Chamber had not previously been involved in any kind of disaster relief, but stepped up to help businesses and individuals in the area recover.

As for other accomplishments, Medley pointed to continued work of the Kentucky Chamber Foundation to ensure a successful workforce in the Commonwealth through the Talent Pipeline Management® program and efforts to strengthen education by offering executive-level training to school principals free of charge through the Leadership Institute for School Principals initiative.

"The Chamber has also strengthened its mission in a number of ways, especially through the creation of two new centers: the Foundation's Center for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion as well as the Kentucky Chamber Center for Policy and



Research. Through these efforts, our organization finds real, tangible ways to make a lasting impact for the business community," she said.

As for why she feels membership to the Kentucky Chamber is so important, Medley said the Chamber gives individuals a meaningful way to build and deepen relationships with peers as well as truly help advance the state.

"If you want to go far, go together," Medley said. "The Chamber is the best group of business leaders in the Commonwealth bar none, people who are genuinely passionate about Kentucky. So, once you get engaged, you get excited yourself and feel like you really can make an impact."



Kentucky Minority-Owned Business Database Now Available

THROUGH THE KENTUCKY CHAMBER FOUNDATION

In an effort to help businesses looking to diversify their supply chain and provide exposure and resources for certified minority-owned businesses, the Kentucky Chamber Foundation's Center for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion has launched the Kentucky Minority-Owned Business Database.

This is the first-ever platform in Kentucky that includes all certified minority-owned businesses in one place. There is a multitude of entities that issue certifications to designate a business as minority-owned, and until now, the business listings were all located on separate websites.

In partnership with various certifying organizations, including the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, the Kentucky Finance and Administration Cabinet, and the City of Louisville, the Kentucky Minority-Owned Business Database has now centralized the listing of more than 1,100 minority-owned businesses.

"As the state's largest business association, we constantly hear from companies that say they want to diversify but have difficulty finding minority-owned suppliers. With this database, the Kentucky Chamber Foundation can better help businesses grow, diversify, and create change," said Ashli Watts, president and CEO of the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce.

"The Kentucky Chamber Foundation is working to address barriers as well as provide opportunities for more Kentuckians to start and grow their business," said Joe Frazier, executive director for the Kentucky Chamber Foundation's Center for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. "With a rate of only 7.7 percent minority-owned businesses across the state, the Kentucky Minority-Owned Business Database is just the beginning of our work to build a stronger Commonwealth."

The 38th Annual Kentucky Society for Human Resource Management (KYSHRM) Conference, presented by Kentucky Career Center, was held on August 30 - September 1, 2022. The COVID-19 pandemic halted travel plans for many over the last few years, and this was no different for the Kentucky Chamber. Over the past decade, the Chamber Board of Directors has been taking international trips where they can network with business leaders, experience other cultures and take away important ideas and lessons that can be implemented here in the Commonwealth.

At the beginning of October, Chamber board members traveled to spend nine days in Italy, the first international trip for the Chamber since 2018. Of course, for anyone that has traveled to Italy, you know there was a plethora of good food, even better wine and plenty of sunshine. But in addition to this, there were also many innovative and creative ideas for our state's top business leaders to take away.

Being an agriculture state, we know how important the farming community is to the overall economy of Kentucky. These are family-owned working farm establishments that are designed to receive guests, whether for fresh farm to table cuisine, or for group experiences showcasing these farms that have been transformed into tourist destinations.

Throughout the Florence and Tuscan region, the group visited local vineyards and farms where families welcome tourists into their homes to sample their wines, sell goods such as beauty products and olive oil, and provide family-style meals for groups large and small. The families that operate these agriturismo operations are savvy business owners, tapping into a booming tourist market and providing authentic, desirable experiences.




