- Fall Protection General Requirements (1926.501)6,010 violations
- 2. Hazard Communication (1910.1200) 3,671 violations
- Scaffolding (1926.451) 2,813 violations
- Lockout/Tagout (1910.147) 4 2,606 violations
- Respiratory Protection (1910.134) 2,450 violations
- Ladders (1926.1053) 2,345 violations

- Powered Industrial Trucks (1910.178) 2,093 violations
- Fall Protection Training Requirements 8 (1926.503)1,773 violations
- 9. Machine Guarding (1910.212) 1,743 violations
- 10. Personal Protective and Lifesaving Equipment - Eye and Face Protection (1926.102)1,411 violations

NOTE: Generally, OSHA does not post the top ten violations until after the first week in April, so as to allow the prior fiscal year's inspection data to finalize past the close of the fiscal year (September 30th).
