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Continue building and investing in a high-quality K-12 and postsecondary education system focused on workforce development in high-growth industries and postsecondary training.

KENTUCKY'S WINNING STRATEGY:

Through the Foundation's partnership with the Truist Leadership Institute, our organization has provided training for more than 520 publicand private-school principals from across

Kentucky through the Leadership Institute for

School Principals program. <u>In 2023, 42 principals, representing 20,800 Kentucky students from 33 counties, participated in the program.</u> More than \$217,000 was committed in 2023 by the Kentucky business community to provide this program at no cost to the participating principals.





This year, the Foundation partnered with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation's **National Civics Bee**, a competition to help show young Americans how they can positively contribute to their local communities. In the second year of



the National Civics Bee, the Foundation collaborated with six local chambers of commerce to host regional competitions. Almost 500 students entered the competition by submitting essays on how to solve a problem in their community. The students with the top 20 essays in each region were invited to participate in the regional competitions.

The top three finalists from each regional competition went on to participate in the Kentucky State Finals, which was held at the Kentucky State Fair in August in partnership with Kentucky Venues. During the competition, students participated in multiple rounds of civics questions, and the students with the top scores gave a speech on the essay they submitted in front of a panel of judges. The top three students won cash prizes from \$500 to \$1,000, and the state champion, Javan Dotson, was named.







Kentucky must begin growing the overall size of its workforce or risk being left behind as other states dramatically outpace the Commonwealth for workforce growth.

KENTUCKY'S WINNING STRATEGY:

The Foundation's **Talent Pipeline Management (TPM®)** initiative is a collaborative and systematic approach to solving the diverse workforce needs across Kentucky. The primary goal of this initiative is to enhance the availability of a skilled workforce in each industry by creating alignment between employers, educational institutions,

alignment between employers, educational institutions, partners, and state and local resources. This initiative actively engages nearly 600 employers in different industry collaboratives across the Commonwealth. Since 2018, TPM® has successfully facilitated more than 6,700 placements for Kentuckians in job opportunities, training

programs, and work-based learning experiences. In 2023, <u>TPM® worked with employers and state partners to establish pathways and engage 1,600 Kentuckians in training and career-related opportunities.</u> These

opportunities have led to the direct placement of nearly 500 Kentuckians into meaningful employment this year.





As substance use disorder is a root cause of Kentucky's workforce crisis, the Foundation's Kentucky Comeback initiative has several programs that provide pathways for employers to help more Kentuckians reach long-term recovery while supporting fair chance employment. Since its inception in 2021, the **Kentucky Transformational**



Employment Program (KTEP) has supported almost 150 employers as they look to recruit and retain the workforce they need to support and grow their businesses. The program provides a framework for employers to facilitate access to substance use disorder treatment for current employees or candidates and also encourages businesses to hire people impacted by substance use.

In 2023, the **Fair Chance Academy** provided 80 employers from Kentucky's diverse industries with training and resources to help their companies successfully hire, train, and retain exceptional talent from fair chance populations. These employers have hired more than 415 Kentuckians from incarceration or the recovery community in the past year as a direct result of the Fair Chance Academy model.



Kentucky must continue its progress in increasing its rates of postsecondary attainment while also continuing to build a strong educational foundation at the early childhood and K-12 levels.

KENTUCKY'S WINNING STRATEGY:

Bus to Business® is a statewide initiative focused on connecting students with employers and showing students what career pathways are available in their communities. In 2023, the Foundation worked with 40 different employers from 16 industries in Kentucky to engage over 2,500 students in career-related discussions and activities. As a direct outcome of these initiatives, nearly 150 students have successfully secured connections to internships, apprenticeships, or job opportunities.

INCLUSIVE WORKFORCE

KENTUCKY'S WINNING STRATEGY:

Last year, the Foundation launched the Kentucky Minority-Owned Business Database (MBDKY.com), which has <u>helped connect</u> more than 900 certified minority-owned businesses with nearly 5,000 Kentucky businesses looking to diversify their supply chains.

In 2023, the Foundation hosted multiple Minority-Owned Business Certification events in different areas of the state. <u>This effort has engaged more than 100 businesses to learn more about the various minority-owned business certifications and the benefits of becoming certified.</u>

Also, the Foundation launched a diversity and inclusion training, collaborating with nearly 50 employers to enhance their practices for recruiting and retaining diverse talent. Through these efforts, the Foundation team has been working to ensure that individuals throughout the state are presented with opportunities to enhance their learning and earning potential. Through the Chamber's strong employer network, the Foundation has led more than 30 speaking and training sessions with nearly 3,000 business
