Superintendent, LaRue County Schools

Adryanne Warren has proudly served as Superintendent of LaRue County Schools since July 1, 2024. With a deeprooted commitment to student success, family engagement, and staff support, she has focused her leadership on fostering a strong district culture, expanding learning opportunities, and improving access to essential resources. A lifelong learner and dedicated educator, Adryanne began her professional journey in the business



sector. While working in Accounts Receivable at Hardin Memorial Hospital, she earned a Business Degree from Western Kentucky University. After a brief tenure at Abound Credit Union, she discovered her passion for education and returned to school, earning her master's degree in elementary education from the University of the Cumberlands. In 2014, she began her teaching career as a 5th grade writing teacher at Abraham Lincoln Elementary in the LaRue County School District. While in the classroom, she continued to further her education, earning her Rank I certification through Asbury University with credentials in school administration, instructional supervision, and as a Director of Pupil Personnel. After six years in the classroom, she transitioned into a district-level role as a Curriculum Specialist, serving both elementary schools in LaRue County for two years. In 2022, she was asked to step in as interim principal at LaRue County Middle School. Her leadership and impact led to her permanent appointment as principal in March 2023, a role she held until her selection as superintendent the following year. In the fall of 2023, she returned to Asbury University to pursue her superintendent certification. In April 2024, she was named the next superintendent of LaRue County Schools. During her first year in the role, she prioritized innovation and access by launching SOAR Academy, a new virtual learning program designed to provide flexible learning opportunities for students and families. She is also leading efforts to establish a school-based childcare center to support both staff and the broader community. Her leadership has emphasized building a positive, inclusive culture through increased visibility, engagement, and support across all schools. Outside of her professional life, she has been married to her husband, Cody Warren, for 17 years. Together, they are raising four daughters— Ava, Kaylee, Leah, and Hannah—on their family farm in LaRue County, where they enjoy life alongside cattle, horses, rabbits, and their dog, Jenny.
